“His Kingdom Will Come”

Daniel 7 is a chapter of pure future prophecy.

One of the great verifications of the _____ of the Bible is this element of fulfilled prophecy.

We have in this one chapter the outline of the sweep for the whole history of the future of the world.

Why did God reveal this to Daniel?

Because Israel feared God had _____ them.

God gives them a word through Daniel that there is yet a glorious and marvelous future for them.

The people had begun to doubt; they're beginning to question whether or not God is going to be able to pull off the salvation of His people.

There have been some critical writings on Daniel which deny the whole book, "The whole thing is a fairy tale; it isn't true."

But here we are immediately confronted with a historical fact.

The theme, the major point of this vision, is the coming of the King and the establishment of His eternal Kingdom.

There are three aspects of the Kingdom that are in this chapter. First, the coronation of the King. Secondly, the character of the Kingdom. And thirdly, the chronology of the Kingdom.

And these answer the questions, "Who?" "What?" And "When?"

This is the absolute apex of history. This is the crucial moment in the history of eternity. This is the greatest event in all of God's time and eternity, the coronation of the King of Kings and Lord of Lords.
