The law of non-contradiction is that something cannot be at the same time true and false. Such as John’s statement in v 21, “I have not written to you because you do not know the truth, but because you know it, and that no lie is of the truth.”

Truth and non-truth are not equal. They are, in fact, incompatible.

Your _____ proceeds from Christ, it is internal, it abides in you, it is permanent.

We're not dependent on human wisdom, because we have a divine source of truth and a divine resident teacher.

John says you have the truth; you have the Spirit. He says let that abide in you which you heard from the beginning.

There's a human responsibility here. We need to persevere. You are eternally secure, but you persevere in faith.

True Christians will do that; they'll hang on to the truth. But not without sanctified, Spirit-empowered effort.
