Part II: Answer Key

1. The final form of the fourth kingdom will not fade away gradually but will be shattered in a momentous occasion. It is prophesied to be smashed and cut into bits by the "stone cut without hands," representing the immediate return of Christ and the establishment of His eternal Kingdom.
2. The end of the times of the nations occurs in three distinct phases: first, the emergence of a 10-nation confederacy; second, the rise of a specific ruler out of that confederacy; and third, the ultimate destruction of that system by God.
3. The prophecy describes the "King of the North" (likely Russia) attacking Israel and being wiped out by God, which creates a massive power vacuum in the region. This vacuum allows the Western Roman Confederated Empire to move in and dominate the world during the middle of the tribulation.
4. While the entire tribulation spans seven years, the world empire system and the beast only exercise ultimate power for the final 42 months of that period. This timeline aligns with the midpoint of the tribulation when the one-world system truly takes hold.
5. In Genesis 3:15, God promised that the Seed of the woman would bruise the head of the serpent, referring to the coming of Jesus Christ to destroy Satan. Consequently, Satan has spent all of redemptive history attempting to stop the birth of Jesus Christ and destroy the people of God.
6. Satan primarily attacks the church through infiltration rather than outside opposition alone. He uses apostates to enter the church and undermine its mission from within, attempting to corrupt the program of God.
7. Hitler believed there was a magical relationship between man and the universe and saw his life as the work of unseen, unworldly forces. He viewed himself as a medium destined to present a "new gospel" to humanity, driven by mystical and satanic influences.
8. This theory claims the center of the earth is hollow and inhabited by superior demonic beings who are the "lords of the universe." Hitler was so convinced of this that he launched expeditions to find the hollow earth, believing these beings would eventually surface to help him conquer the world.
9. Karl Haushofer was a prominent general and an advisor to Hitler who functioned as a black magician or "warlock." He was a member of the Golden Dawn society and introduced various Buddhist and occultist rituals into the inner circle of the Nazi party.
10. The next major prophetic event is the blowing of the trumpet by the angel of God, signaling the Rapture. This event will remove believers from the earth and usher in a combined time of destruction by Satan and judgment by God.

Part III: Essay Questions

Instructions: Use the insights from the lesson to develop detailed responses to the following prompts.

1. **The Accuracy of Prophecy:** Analyze the argument that one cannot be an "intelligent skeptic" regarding biblical prophecy. Use the historical transitions from the Babylonian, Medo-Persian, and Greek empires to the future Roman Confederacy as evidence.
2. **Geopolitical Vacuums and the Tribulation:** Discuss the relationship between the events of Ezekiel 38–39 and the rise of the 10-nation confederacy. How does the destruction of northern alliances facilitate the transition into a one-world government?
