**Selected Scriptures**

**After the destruction of antichrist, we have the immediate arrival of Jesus Christ.**

**Remember what I said last time, be careful how you interpret history. If you interpret it carefully enough and compare it with Scripture, you’ll wind up being a Christian.**

**Satan would love to change God’s plan of \_\_\_\_\_.**

**The first title of antichrist is “little horn.” A second one is “the king of the angry \_\_\_\_\_.”**

**Next, he is called, “the prince who is to come.”**

**A fourth name in Daniel 11 – verse 16, he’s called the willful king.**

**Antichrist can’t be a Jew because the one biblical example we have of antichrist is Antiochus Epiphanes and he was a gentile. And two, in Daniel 9:26, he is identified with the people who destroyed Jerusalem.**

**In the New Testament he is called “man of sin” and “son of perdition.”**

**Some say because he's called the son of perdition and \_\_\_\_\_ is also called the son of perdition, that the antichrist will be a resurrected \_\_\_\_\_.**

**And finally, another name of antichrist is "\_\_\_\_\_."**

**Antichrist could well be a gentile from the \_\_\_\_\_ area.**

**Animals always defend themselves with the use of their horn, and the horn became a symbol of power.**

**In Revelation 17:9, the "seven heads" represent "seven mountains." This would be the city of Rome.**

**The "seven kings" of Revelation 17:10 are forms of gentile government.**

**There have been five forms of government: Greece, Persia, Assyria, Babylon, and Egypt.**

**This is quite an individual. Tremendous power and authority worldwide.**
